- Please comment on the student's cultural preparation, maturity, and coping skills for research abroad.
- Does the proposal show careful preliminary investigation, including necessary bibliography?
- What kind of supervision will the student need and have during the research period? Please describe the contacts/ supervision the student will have at the research site.
- Will you be available to communicate with the student during the summer? If so, how?
- Please indicate any necessary prior permission/approval from UNH or foreign institutions for student access to resources during the project. Example: Does the student need permission from UNH's Institutional Review Board? All things considered, including the student's capability, is the project location and nature of research safe?
- Is the budget a reasonable request for this student's project? Please also indicate approval by signing the budget form.
- In your estimation, should UNH underwrite the funding of this particular student's research?
- What is the significance of the project and its potential educational value for the student?
